Referring to Nurse Hawken's death the "Luminary" says, Miss Hawken who was matron of the Bay of Islands Hospital when the war broke out, was amongst the first to offer her services when it was known that nurses were required, and leave of absence being gained by the Hospital Board on the understanding that the position would remain open to her at the close of the war, she left by the hospital ship, "Maheno". Several letters were received from her en voyage, but no intimation of her illness, and the news of her untimely end came therefore as a great shock to her very large circle of friends in the Bay of Islands. As hospital matron, Miss Hawken did excellent work, and won the respect and esteem of all with whom she came in contact. At the call of duty, she gave up a comfortable position when she was doing good work, feeling that she might be able to help in assisting the brave boys who were wounded at the battle front, and truly her life was given to the cause, even though she did not live long enough to give all the help she so nobly set out to offer. 9/11/15 A vote of conlances was passed to the parents of the late Nurse Hawken who had just died at Alexandria Hospital, Nurse Hawken was formerly Matron of the Kawakawa Hospital

The household of Mr J H Saies of Totara North, Whangaroa Harbour has provided no less than 7 soldiers for the Army, while an eight offered his services but was obliged to stay at home owing to medical unfitness. Six of the young men left NZ in one reinforcement draft. The names of the eight are: Alfred, killed in action, 16 Sept 1916; Joseph, Arthur, Edward and James are still fighting in France; Albert and Frederick have returned with honourable wounds and been discharged; and Charles, is the man who was debarred from following the patriotic example of his brothers through a physical defect.

*Foreword. Stretcher Bearer's Heroism. How a New Zealander Died. An interesting story has come to hand relating to Rfm G L Skinner, a well known farmer in North Auckland, met his death at the front, near Ypres. Rfm Skinner was reported missing, believed killed in action. The letter is from a comrade of his in the Rifle Brigade. J D Inglis, of Christchurch. The writer says:*

*Whilst looking through list No 13 of missing soldiers, I came across the name of Rfm G L Skinner, 48576, killed in action November 22. 1917 Everything seems to point to this lad being the same one as I knew. I knew Skinner, who was in A Company, No 4 Platoon, Second Battalion of the Rifle Brigade, and this soldier was killed about November 22. He came across from NZ with me in the Athenic, and he was in G Company, 27<sup>th</sup> reinforcements.*

*He was killed whilst with a stretcher party for which volunteers had been called. This lad was one of the first to step out and volunteer. The wounded man was a heavy man and the stretcher party was a big one, six men and sergeant. We were in the front line digging a trench, and it was pitch dark and frosty. The enemy was shelling the positions behind the front line very heavily. The stretcher party had to pass through the barrage, but they could not wait very long for it to lift as the man on the stretcher was badly wounded. Never once did any of the party hesitate, and after resting for a moment or two in the shelter of a pill box, they started out.*

*We heard the shell explode close to the party, and guessed the result. When the party had got out they found that the lot had got it. Skinner had died instantly and so had others. They were all buried the next day and the necessary papers taken. Skinner grave is in Ypres district, in the neighbourhood of Polygon Wood. It is situated midway between two cement houses, which are called pillboxes. The names of the pillboxes in the neighbourhood are : The Lion House, Cameron House, Jerk House and Black Watch Dressing Station. The party had been making for Black Watch Dressing Station, but owing to the shelling, had decided to shelter under the side of Jerk House. The grave is situated between Jerk House and Cameron House, and was marked with a plain white wooden cross.*

*Skinner was looked upon by all who knew him as a through gentleman, a good sport, and true mate.*

*Taken from a newspaper clipping, the name of the newspaper and the date published (1920?) are unknown Laurence's grave was later lost, probably destroyed by enemy shelling during the early months of 1918, when the NZ Division was wintering in Polygon Wood. Laurence's name is engraved on the NZ Memorial for the Missing, as the Buttes New British Cemetery, Polygon Wood, Belgium.*
