Buried at sea. Born Hokianga Northland 20/3/1882. Educated Auckland, C/o Hayward, Waihi, Bay of Plenty, Surveyor, single.

(AWN 10/6/15) Anderson, Henry Kemp, Mrs Anderson has received official information that her son died of wounds on 21 May. The deceased who was a native of Auckland, was a surveyor. He was 33 yrs of age and unmarried.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. On the 1st October 1918 during an attack on enemy positions east of Manieres, this N.C.O. who was in charge of a left flank platoon, showed most magnificent courage and ability in the handling of his men. At a very critical stage during an enemy counter attack, although wounded, this N.C.O. remained with his platoon and organized a defensive attack. He personally supervised the retirement of his men under intense enemy fire, and by his splendid example and excellent command enabled his platoon to reach the defensive line without being surrounded and cut off. After satisfying himself that the enemy attack had been stopped, he handed over his command and went back to have his wounds dressed. His conduct throughout was magnificent and he inspired his men in a most remarkable manner.

News has now been received that he was killed in action on the Somme.

*Sgt L N Begg, Auckland Infantry Battalion, (Killed), was a son of the late James Begg, engineer who came to NZ from Glasgow under engagement to Anderson's Engineering works, Christchurch. Prior to his father's death he was studying dentistry under Sir Charles Burdett, at Eltham, but gave up his studies in order to support his mother and younger brother. He was a member of the volunteers and on the inauguration of the Territorials scheme joined the Territorials holding the rank of Company Sergeant Major when the war broke out. His age was 21 years and 8 months.
 (AWN 17/6/15) Begg, Sgt Kenneth Humphreys of the AIB who is reported to have been killed in action 25 April was 21 yrs old. He was the eldest son of Mrs Begg of Hokianga. His father, who was an engineer died two yrs ago. At the time his son was studying dentistry under Sir Charles Burdett of Eltham but broke his studies to look after his mother's interests. Sgt Begg had always taken a keen interest in military matters and was as a member of the 15th Nth Ak Regt he left with the main expeditionary force. His younger brother, James ?? yrs of age recently enlisted for the fray. Mrs Begg has been a resident of the Hokianga for the past 25 yrs.*

He is about 25 yrs of age.

He saw active service in the attack on the Suez Canal, but was ? down with fever for four months, followed by sunstroke. Later, after eight's service in Egypt he was sent home suffering from pluerisy for treatment at Hampstead Hospital. Private Blundell who is the third son of Mr Percy Blundell, one of the oldest settlers of Kohukohu, was born in that settlement, and is 32 years of age. Prior to enlistment, he was employed as an engineer.

16/9/15 Brook, Sgt Julian Cornelius who has been twice wounded and is now in hospital at Malta, was prior to enlisting practicing as a barrister and solicitor at Kohukohu. His parents live at Birkdale.

19/9/18 Brook, Lt J C, died of wounds, was the eldest son of Mr J C Brook, headmaster of Birkdale School. He was practicing as a solicitor in the north at the outbreak and enlisted with the MB, leaving nz with the rank of Cpl in the 15th Nth Ak Comp. He was twice wounded on Gallipoli, the first time on the day of the landing. Returning after recovering from his second injury, a gunshot wound to the face, he was among the last of the Ak Batt to leave the Peninsula upon the evacuation of Anzac. After considerable service in France he was nominated for a commission in the NZ forces and returned to NZ for his appointment. He left with a Rft draft last year and was employed for some time in instructional duty in England.

(AWN 29/3/17) Philips, Pte Malcolm, of the WIB, previously reported missing and now reported killed in action on 28 Sept was the eldest son of Mr Henry Philips of Kohukohu. From letters received from the front it appears he was on a journey of special danger when he met his death. He was a keen hockey player and served in the territorials.

According to information received by his relatives he volunteered to carry dispatches from the trenches to HQ at a critical period.
