**ON GUARD** Tuesday September 26<sup>th</sup> 1916

Mr T W Berghan was one of the original Anzacs, "Fredo" (by which name he is familiarly known) is a son of Mrs M J Berghan, who is well known throughout the North. He served as a gunner and was severely wounded at Gallipoli being eventually invalided home. He recently volunteered a second time, but has been placed on the deferred list. "Fredo" hopes however, to get away again in November.

**NA** 6/9/15 Gunner T W Berghan who is reported to have been wounded, was serving with the Field Artillery. He is the youngest son of Mrs M J Berghan of Mangonui, North Auckland, and is only 19 years of age. He was a member of the North Auckland Territorials, but wishing to join the Artillery, he put in three months training at Fort Cautley, and enlisted in the Field Artillery in the First Reinforcements.

*(AWN 5/7/17) Bishop, the number of Auckland fighting families who have sent all their sons to the war is constantly increasing. The three sons of Mr J Bishop of Dunegan, Titirangi have all enlisted as volunteers. The eldest son J Bishop, who left NZ as a Sergeant last year, received a commission in London after several months service in France and has returned to the front. Sgt T A Bishop, the second son, after being detained on duty for some months in England, also recently went to France. The third and youngest son is Ptr W N C Bishop, who is now in camp. The three brothers were educated at the Titirangi and Avondale schools and the Auckland Grammar School. Their grandfather, the late Mr J Bishop, fought in one of the Maori wars.*

*(AWN 25/10/17) Bishop, Lt J J, who has been killed in action, was the eldest son the three sons of Mr J J Bishop of Dunvegan, Titirangi, all of whom went on active service. Lt Bishop, who was a teacher in the employ of the Auckland Education Board, was educated at the Titirangi and Avondale schools and went through a two year course at the Auckland Training College. He was in charge of the Kaitaia school prior to his enlistment/ He left as a Sergeant in the Rifle Brigade in the 13<sup>th</sup> Rfts in 1916. He went to France from England as a private and obtained some of his first experiences of the firing line as a member of a Lewis machine gun section. He subsequently was promoted on the field and on obtaining his commission was attached to the OIB. He was 24 years of age.*

*(AWN 29/3/17) Blucher, Sgt A N, who was wounded severely in the face and hands on 21 Feb is one of six brothers on active service, the sons of Mr E Blucher, Beresford St, Auckland. Sgt Blucher enlisted with the AMR and left NZ in Dec 1914. After arriving in Egypt he transferred to the Machine Gun Section and fought through the Gallipoli campaign until Sept 1915 when he was invalided to England. On recovery he left for Egypt and in May last received his Sgt stripes. One of his brothers was wounded in the advance on the Somme and is now in England making good progress.*

<i>(AWN 9/11/16) Blucher, Six members of one family from Houhora, the sons of Mr Edmund Blucher formerly of Hawea now of Beresford St Auckland. The youngest son Norman went to Egypt with the 3<sup>rd</sup> Ak M/R, was transferred to the Machine Gun Section and served at Gallipoli. He was then invalided to England, then to France and promoted to Sergeant. He is still in France, Edmund served in the Boer war, is now on the water, Charles left later, Alfred J Frederick Desmond, wounded on the Somme, A W in camp at Featherston.</i>			
<i>18/10/17 Blucher, an excellent record in the service of their country is that of the family of Mr G E Blucher of 64 Beresford St, all of whose sons, six in number have left on active service as volunteers. Cable advice has just been received that the third son, Sgt C T Blucher has been killed in action in France. He was 32 years of age and left with the 7<sup>th</sup> Rfts. He had been in France for the past two years, during which he had only had 10 days leave. The other sons are Gunners AW &amp; AJ Blucher, who left with the Machine Gun Corps attached to the 21<sup>st</sup> Rfts and now are in France. Gnr CFE Blucher attached to the ASC of the 18<sup>th</sup> Rfts, who is also in France. Pte D F Blucher who left with 7<sup>th</sup> Rfts and was wounded in France over a year ago and is in hospital in England, and Company Sergeant Major A M Blucher who, at the age of 19 enlisted in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Rfts and after seeing service on Gallipoli was invalided to England. He afterwards left with the NZ Division for France, where he was wounded in February last. After spending some time in hospital he was attached to the HQ Staff in England.</i>

**ON GUARD** 10/10/16 Pte Lup Gardiner writes to his brother Mr A A Gardiner Kaiaka. Walton, 10/8/16. Just a line or two to say that I am still in the land of living and enjoying good health, and hope this scribble finds you all the same. Well, old chap, I am still in the hospital, in fact I think the place is mine, for the time I have been in it. I think I will be leaving here in about a week's time for Barton on the Sea, that is not far from Brighton on the sea. They have been putting us through a new course of treatment for dysentery germs, and we have had good results so far, but the next trouble is how long is it going to last, and what is going to be the effects on an man's constitution after? The cursed stuff is a thousand times worse than the disease. It shakes you up. It also brings on dysentery again. I have lost over two stone in the twelve days treatment. I do not want to go through it again. I am writing this letter on the banks of the Thames, and there is just one stream of pleasure boats up and down the river, from canoe up to five hundred ton steamers. I see a lot of pals have gone under and others wounded. Willie Wagener got passed out, and young Bayliss of Hukerenui is wounded, also George Groves of Whakapara. Old Roney Matthews is still alive. I saw him here the other day on furlough from France. I saw one of Harry Ellis's boys here with sickness. It is the second boy. He was telling me that the big headed joker is married and also , Kiwi. In speaking of the wounded I forgot to tell you that poor old shriveled up Dick Boufaye is wounded to.I did not think they could hit him with a bullet, as you could not see him twenty yards off. We are still having a good time of it, going to London to music halls etc. I also had a look the other day at Windsor Castle. It is a great building. A man cannot form any idea until he sees it. This is a wonderful little island, its worth fighting for. You see thousands upon thousands of acres of wheat, barley, maize and potatoes. They are all hard at work on the harvest. Tell Dad if he could only look on the harvest fields now, it would remind him of his boyhood days, to see thousands of women working in the fields, and plenty of beer too. In one district there are 27 thousand soldiers helping with the harvest. Well, Kai ora old boy for the present.

**THE ANZAC** Tuesday August 15<sup>th</sup> 1916

*Harold E Houston was theseventh son of the late Mr R M Houston, for many years the representative in Parliament of the Bay of Islands electorate, and one of the North's most prominent public men. There is perhaps no more loyal and patriotic family to be found any-where than the Houstons. Some of the boys served in the Boer War, and several have been and are fighting now for King and Country. Harold went out into the "great adventure" bravely and proudly, in high spirits, and laid down his life in the noblest cause of all – the cause of liberty. He was 30 years of age, being born in Mangonui in 1886. he was educated at Newton East School and Grammer (Auckland). For a time Harold worked on the staff of the newspaper at Mangonui, afterwards going to Suva, Fiji, where he was employed successively on the Western Pacific Herald, and in the Government printing office.*

**OG 27/3/17 Pte Donald (Chappie) McKay writes home as follows. In NZ Base Camp, France, 24/10/16. My Dear Mum, Just a few lines to let you know I am well and OK. I have been here five days. The Reinforcements stop here, but I only saw Alf Christensen that I knew. A lot are still in England, I thought I might have seen Will Houston or others. I haven't had any letters since I was up the line, but expect there are some for me. My word, Mum, the weather is getting very cold. The last few days there have been heavy frosts and bitterly cold wind. I haven't heard anything from Charlie at all. I heard that poor old Ned and Seddon also were among the wounded. I heard of Sergeant who was in my platoon, Israel, a real nice chap being dead, so another chap and I went to a big cemetery not very far from here and looked among the NZ graves. Poor old Gerry, he was a good chap right enough. While we were there they brought in eight more, and we saw their funeral. A lot of Tommies wheeled the coffins in, each on a stretcher with the Union Jack over it, and the parson in front. They were all placed in a row, then he read the burial service. There must have been 3000 graves in this cemetery, and each one is numbered. Anybody wanting to find a certain grave looks up the chart and knows exactly where to find it. There are a lot of Tommies and Scotties here, It is a big base. Every night there are some concerts. The other night the Maoris gave a haka or two and a few songs. It did amuse the Tommies and Kitlies. It's quite nice to hear a bit of music and sing song again. I heard a nice band a few nights ago, composed of a few brass instruments about 10 fiddles and a big cello. You know, Anyway it was good. I don't suppose Mangonui will be very lively this Xmas. Well never mind, you will have nice sunny weather. Go for a drive if nothing else to do. Make it the best of it, for the next will be worse, I think. When I got here I found one of my mates from up the line, George Bellve, Steves brother. He's a good chap, Today its raining. We have about 8 blankets and are in the tent alone, and I laugh at George. He's just been making the bed, I punch him on the shoulder, like I use to do to you, and he sings out "Mac Mac stop stop" We have a lot of fun. Had our dinner at the canteen today. A tin of peaches, some custard and a tin of cream that they sell. Its just like real cream, in little tins, cost 1/8, tinned fruit 10d custard 8d two scones 4d, tea 3d, so we had a nice meal. Flash eh, withcream at that price. However Mum I must say tat a, with love to Dad and May and all from your loving son. *WILLIS William Brian de Laval, 12/289 Cpl 3<sup>rd</sup> Ak Coy AIB (enlisted 12/8/14) MB WIA (gunshot wound to chest and lungs) evening 5/5/15 while embarking on lighter to begin journey to Helles. Lt Col Plugge helped dress Willis' wound. Evacuated abroad Gloucester Castle to Deaconess Hospital, Alexandria. DOW 12/5/15 in Egypt aged 27 yrs. Born the Vicarage Cambridge 17/5 1888. Educated Cambridge District High School and St Johns College Auckland (1904, prefect, head boy. Cricket 1<sup>st</sup> X1, shooting team, rugby 1<sup>st</sup> XV, cadets sgt) Government Surveyor, Lands Dept, Northland, from 1/2/06 until enlisting. Part-time gumdigger in Northland. NOK F (eldest son of) Archdeacon William Newcombe de Laval (M Mary Agnes) Willis "Kilpeacen" Cambridge, Waikato. Bros, 54674 Sgt Alan Newcombe de Laval Willis also served WW1, Frank Willis served WW1 in the British Army.*

Willis, a tablet in memory of Corporal Brian Willis, eldest son of the Ven Archdeacon Willis of Cambridge, who Died of Wounds, has been erected in the Mangonui Hospital by friends of that district. The inscription on the tablet is as follows, "In memoriam", Corporal Brian de le Laval Willis, died at Alexandria of wounds received in action at the Dardenelles, May 18<sup>th</sup> 1915, "Greater love hath no man, that a man lay down his life".*
