He gained the rank of Sgt/Mjr after the evacuation of Gallipoli, following which he was appointed 2/Lt in the Imperial Camel Corps, Egypt, acting as intelligence officer for his brigade. He was educated at the Paeroa District High School. A brother, QM Sgt W M Adoplh, is on active service in France.

Whitfield (Bee) had a farm at Te Anga, just opposite to Lawford. He was killed in action, aged 30 years. He left his farm to Percival Leonard, whose plans for settling down in his new home in Wellsford were upset. "Jim" sold out in Wellsford and went to the Te Anga farm.

William Armitage of Leeds, a 21 year old bachelor immigrant in "Matilda" was engaged in the glove and hosiery trade in the Midlands. He was quite an exceptional musician being at the age of 14 years a violinist in the orginal orchestra developed by Sir Charles Halle in his home city. William brought his musical ability with him, becoming the conductor of various choirs amongst the settlers. He married Mary Ann Brookes, and when their first child, Stanley William, was born at Wharehine the family moved for a while to Christchurch, where the next three children were born. Marion, Lewis and Lawford. About 1882, William was appointed manager of the Port Albert Co-operative Society's branch store on the Whakapirau Creek, and in 1885 he purchased a property of one hundred acres in what is now Wellsford County Town. Meanwhile the rest of his eleven children of Leonora and Whitfield (twins), Isobel, Robert, Lawrence, Percival Leonard and Hazel Dell were born. In 1904 the Wellsford home was moved to a farm on the Whangaripo Road, where the family lived till 1914. In that year they returned to Wellsford, but William died in 1915, His Mary Ann followed him in 1916. Wellsford, Tidal Creek to Gum Ridge.

Was on the Ballarat (Troopship) when it was torpedoed, 25th April 1917

He was wounded in several places severely, during the attack on Mont St Quentin on Sept 1<sup>st</sup> 1918. He was in a bombing party when a shell burst near him. Cpl Rogers of the same platoon and battalion was with him at the time and gave me these particulars of his casualty. He was taken back by stretcher bearers as soon as possible and died at the G C S on Sept 2<sup>nd</sup> and was buried and cross erected near Cappy together with two other chaps. I have seen the grave and have asked Pte Michie of the grave section to send me a photo of the grave to send to his people. He was a great mate of mine as we came away together with the 24<sup>th</sup> Rfts to 7<sup>th</sup> Battalion on the "Ballarat" 19<sup>th</sup> Feb 1917 He is a single man, about 31 years of age, dark complexion, short to medium build, genial disposition, and well liked by everyone. He came from Queensland to enlist in Victoria and his people reside at Springbank, Ballarat, Victoria

I beg to bring to your notice the gallant conduct of 3/483 Sgt Ormond Edward Burton during the operations of his Battalion on the morning of the 24th inst. Before the Company had proceeded 200 yards from the starting point, Sqt Burton took over his platoon, his Officer having been wounded, and with zeal led his men in the frontline of the attack. On reaching the southern outskirts of Grevillers considerable opposition was encountered and the Sergeant was sniped in the wrist. Nevertheless, and though his arm was useless, he continued to bravely led his platoon, and under contant exposure to machine gun, rifle and shellfire, he so advantageously disposed his men that the ridge running south from the village was firmly secured against the enemy. The capture of six machine guns which fell to the platoon's lot, was mostly due to the bravery and dash of the

Sergeant. It was not until many hours after being wounded when his platoon was firmly established on this ridge that Serg Burton was prevailed upon to be evacuated.

26/7/17 Lennan, A splendid record of one family's war service was disclosed when the Auckland Military Service Board reviewed the case of Paul Lennan, Dairyman, Wairewa. His mother Dora Lennan and Major Whitney supported the appeal for exemption on the ground of undue hardship, he being practically the sole support of his parents. Out of a family of 8 sons, one had been killed in action, three were now serving in France and one in Egypt. The sixth brother had been retained for home service and the seventh, who was married had enlisted and been granted extension of time to complete some contracts. His father was 74 years old and unable to work, while his mother at 65 was in very poor health. They lived with appellant who was the youngest of the family and had recently married. Appellant was managing a farm for a neighbour so that the latter's son could enlist. Aided by a sister, he was at present milking 39 cows. With so many brothers away he considered he had to stay and look after his parents and maintain the farm.

The 4<sup>th</sup> Squadron hold right and 3<sup>rd</sup> Squadron hold the left of section of fire trenches, 11<sup>th</sup> are in support. At about 3 30, the enemy assault our trenches in superior force, but are driven off at 4 30 am, by gallant counter attacks by a Troop of 4<sup>th</sup> commanded by Lieut C James and also by a Troop of 11<sup>th</sup> Squadron commanded by Lieut P Logan. A Troop of 3<sup>rd</sup> Squadron under Lieut F J Weir fought with great tenacity and drove off three charges of Turks who launched a force against No 5 sap on our left. The enemy leave the ground strewn with dead and wounded, our casualties were as follows. Killed 22, wounded 27.

J C E Wyatt (Eddie to his friends), who like most New Zealand's First World War veterans is now well into his eighties, joined the Territorials when they were first formed. He was actually No 9 in his 15th North Auckland Regiment on 12th May 1911, aged 19 years. He soon transferred to the 3rd Auckland Mounted Rifles, went overseas with the Main Body and can remember the parade in Warkworth on 9th August 1914, before the first 13 or 14 local volunteers left by steamer from Leigh to Auckland and an encampment at the Epsom Showground. He went to Egypt and then to Gallipoli. After the first six weeks his unit was reorganized at Lemnos and then went back to the peninsula.

With the evacuation, it was back to Egypt to their horses and then off to the Sinai campaign. He was wounded at Bir el Abd. It was just a small affair, said Eddie, a bullet through a soft part of the leg. At Makdada they captured a lot of Turks. In the Army a soldier goes where he is sent so Trooper Wyatt was soon off to a cavalry school Heliopolis and then to gas school. His next move was to Bailliol College, Oxford, to train in the OTC for six months. After that, as a second Lieutenant, he was sent back to New Zealand to help train reinforcements at Trentham. On his final leave Eddie was married to a local lass, Miss Ivy Dunning. In camp he was made OC of the 20th reinforcements but peace caught up with them, and they did not leave New Zealand.
